Hyperbole and understatement are related figurative language techniques. With hyperbole, the speaker exaggerates, adding intensity for effect. With understatement, the speaker understates or uses statements that are too weak to accurately describe reality. Since these techniques are so similar, students are often confused by them.

Hyperbole Worksheets (Figurative Language)

Writers sometimes use overstatement phrases with their works to add art and emotions. However, these exaggerations should not be taken literally as they only use it to add effects on facts and for the sake of emphasis. These kinds of phrases are called hyperbole. Hyperbole is a figure of speech which is the opposite of understatement and is derived from a Greek word which means "excess."

Hyperbole is a figure of speech that makes something seem bigger or more important than it really is. It uses exaggeration to express strong emotion, emphasize a point, or evoke humor. Understatement is language that makes something seem less important than it really is. Look at the following examples. Hyperbole It rained enough yesterday to float a steel mill.

Litotes is almost the opposite of hyperbole; it is massive understatement. With litotes, irony is almost always present, but it does not rest in the falsity of the comparison so much as it does the way it is expressed. In the first litotes example above, it is true that being tortured would not be comfortable. ...
