In approaching any assessment of capacity (whether with a view to determining the capacity to make a Will, or to appoint a Power of Attorney or Guardian, or to manage one's own finances), it is vital to provide the elderly individual with an explanation of the nature, scope and purpose of the assessment, terms of confidentiality and information dissemination.

Background: Pain is under-detected and undertreated in people with dementia. A Psychological Assessment involves the planned use of interviews (generally semi-structured) and specific psychometric assessments (tests) to answer questions highlighted in a referral. I find that questions are typically around teasing out complex diagnoses, helping clarify symptoms/coping style/personality, or, specifying the types of therapy and therapist most likely to assist the patient.
